


ABOUT THE FOUNDATION


MENTAL HEALTH FESTIVAL

The Foundation supported MH360, a Mental Health festival celebrating diversity, empathy and collective wellbeing, through talks on *dukha* and finding meaning in life.




DALAI LAMA IN FRAMES

To capture the spirit of His Holiness' commitment to inter-faith harmony and universal peace, two exhibitions were curated in collaboration with The Tibet Museum.




BUDDHISM'S SECULAR TEACHINGS


WISCOMP'S INITIATIVES






Serenity in the World of Chaos: Buddhist Perspectives on Life







MIT World Peace University, Pune

Inaugurated by His Holiness, the first Dalai Lama Chair in Nalanda Studies was established at Goa University in December 2019 and has since been graced with multiple programmes, lectures and events.

Pune-based MIT World Peace University followed next, setting up The Dalai Lama Chair for Indic Studies in October 2020 with Professor Priyankar Upadhyaya (UNESCO Chair for Peace and Intercultural Understanding) at the helm.





The Chairs are aligned with His Holiness' fourth commitment towards preserving and promoting the Nalanda tradition. Inspired by the Nalanda masters' example of using human intelligence to the fullest by employing rigorous reason and logic, the scholars adopt a strictly secular approach to address contemporary predicaments. The Foundation's Fellows have previously given lectures, and continued their teaching engagements at the Chairs fromNovember 2022.


The Foundation was invited by the UN University for Peace, Costa Rica (created by UN General Assembly Resolution 35/55) to conduct a series of lectures, as part of the University's Master's programme in Religion, Culture and Peace Studies. These explored His Holiness the Dalai Lama's philosophy of peace, conflict resolution, inter-faith harmony, and approaches to nurturing compassion. Future lectures and workshops will focus on methodologies from India's civilisational heritage to facilitate internal transformation through secular practices.


Sharing a number of peace-oriented agendas, the Foundation and UPeace also formalised a partnership, signing a Memorandum of Understanding in Geneva in October 2022. Aside from the lectures and workshops, the collaboration is expected to involve a taught course on His Holiness, hosting UPeace students in India for the Gurukul and Interfaith programmes, film screenings, and a range of other transformative initiatives.

Plans to establish a fourth Dalai Lama Chair for Peace Studies at UPeace are in the works along with the Foundation's hopes to create opportunities for engagement between its Indian university partners and UPeace students.






NURTURING RESILIENCE & COMPASSION





Launched in partnership with The Red Door, the Compassion & Resilience Fellowship kicked off in March 2022 with 20 participants aged 21-30 from across the country. With a dynamic, experiential curriculum, the Fellowship focuses on enhancing the psycho-social skills of the participants.

The first cycle concluded in June 2022, with a talk by Rajiv Mehrotra, and the Fellows' personal reflections on how they learned to optimise their social selves and resilience skills through this journey. The second cycle began in July 2022, with ten Fellows and a call for the third cycle has been sent out.



If you are open to having your perceptions challenged, are oriented towards **psycho-spiritual growth**and

see **compassion** as a critical 21st century skill, this Fellowship is for you!



We are looking for individuals who are keen on strengthening their Resilience quotient through a methodical, even exacting exploration of the self. In other words, people who are willing to pry their minds and hearts open and rebuild themselves in a resilience-affirmative mould.

We welcome people who are working [or want to] in the **development sector**, in education and in healthcare, and who recognize Resilience enhancement as a potential game changer for themselves as well as the communities they work with.

The Fellowship program comprises four modules transacted over the course of 3 months. sions will be between 11:00 am and 1:00 pm on either Saturdays or Sundays, and 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm on Wednesday

Depending on the availability of facilitators, we may also schedule sessions between 3:00 pm and 5:00 pm on Saturdays.



Module 1 The Basics

A theoretical exploration of Resilience as a multi-factorial concept and a highly trainable outcome.



Module 2 Reaching In

This module facilitates a deep immersion into oneself (personal/psychological). It is designed to enable an experiential understanding of intrinsic protective factors and the tools to strengthen them.



Module 3 Reaching Out

The objective of this module is to optimize the social self, allowing Fellows to engage most effectively with extrinsic protective factors [family, community, etc].



Going Beyond

This module facilitates a more spiritual, transcendent view of the human condition and an engagement with the process of meaning-making within one's life and circumstances.

Throughout the program, Fellows will be given the opportunity to **engage** with and **learn** from facilitators, and each other.


Celebrating Tibet's Civilizational Heritage in Dharamsala



The Gurukul Programme returned in 2022 for its 26th year, making it the Foundation's longest-running programme. A transformational immersion experience, Gurukul invites Indian university students and recent graduates to live the life of the Tibetan community in exile, offering first-hand insight into their civilisational heritage, Tibetan Buddhism and His Holiness' teachings.

Starting June 7, for three weeks, the Fellows had insightful interactions with cultural institutions such as the Tibetan Institute of Performing Arts, political organisations and members of the Tibetan government in exile, as well as spiritual discussions with Geshe Lhakdor la, and monks and nuns at the Fellows' respective residences – Dolma Ling Nunnery and Tse-Chok-Ling Monastery.

The Fellows were also blessed with a private audience with His Holiness. In the hour-long interaction, he caringly addressed their queries and concerns, while emphasising the importance of compassion in their role as citizens of a global community.






FOUNDATION-SUPPORTED PLAY ADAPTED IN TIBETAN WITH A TIBETAN CAST







WISCOMP INITIATIVE

Where Gender, Wisdom & Compassion Converge

EMBEDDING GENDER JUSTICE IN THE ACADEMY



As part of India International Centre's (IIC) Diamond Jubilee Celebrations, WISCOMP collaborated with the IIC to organise a Dialogue on the role that Higher Education Institutes (HEIs) in India can play in fostering gender equality. Eminent speakers from the fields of law, policy, higher education and the UN system shared insights on a range of equality concerns: What are HEIs doing to bridge gender gaps and break stereotypes, especially in STEM fields? What role does policy play in catalysing these changes? How can HEIs accord legitimacy to action against discrimination while also signalling to society the need for a broader transformative framework on gender justice?





The Dialogue concluded with the launch of a unique handbook introducing a roadmap for participatory gender audits, as well as an exhibition commissioned by WISCOMP: When Women Write...in Words and Pictures.


WISCOMP DIALOGUES



WISCOMP Dialogues is a discussion series that aims to provide a space for sustained public dialogue on pertinent contemporary concerns through the prism of gender. The Dialogues focus on themes of leadership, diversity and co-existence, governance, democracy, conflict transformation, multi-track peace initiatives, diplomacy, and development.

WISCOMP has organised multiple webinars as part of these Dialogues, all with healthy attendance and ever-increasing viewership of the uploaded sessions.

AFGHANISTAN IN TRANSITION: WOMEN'S PERSPECTIVES



WISCOMP organised a Virtual Dialogue in August 2022 to foster conversations on the developments in Afghanistan since the Taliban takeover in 2021 from a gender perspective. The Dialogue brought together Afghan journalists, scholars and civil society actors as well as their Indian counterparts to accent important questions about Afghan women's current roles and realities.

WOMEN AND VULNERABLE GROUPS IN COVID: A SOUTH ASIAN PERSPECTIVE




WISCOMP continued its engagement with the Non Traditional Security Consortium based in Singapore by participating in its NTS-Asia Consortium Annual Conference. Senior Fellow Dr. Mallika Joseph presented a paper on women and vulnerable groups in COVID, detailing the multi-dimensional impact of the pandemic on the well-being of vulnerable communities in South Asian countries.

RECOGNISING DIFFERENCES, BUILDING ON COMMONALITIES WORKSHOP FOR YOUTH LEADERS



In May 2022, WISCOMP organised an experiential workshop for youth leaders from underserved backgrounds who were part of the 2021-22 cohort of DISOM - The Leadership School. The workshop centred on peacebuilding, conflict transformation and helped participants reflect on issues of democratic dialogue, environmental security, disability rights, and gender justice, among others. The session concluded with a guided meditation led by Rajiv Mehrotra and positive closing comments from the participants about the workshop's impact.

Vignettes of Resistance: En-Gendering the Worlds of Labour

The abysmally low female labour force participation rate in India for the past few years raises serious concerns about the construction of egalitarian post pandemic futures. The perpetual invisibilization, underpaid and overexploited nature of women's work ensures that the worlds of labour remain sites of alienation, exploitation and oppression for many women. Prof Mary John and Dr Meena Gopal's edited anthology 'Women in the Worlds of Labour' (2021) begins with this crisis of women's labour.

The discussion seeks to take forward the ideas from this book on women's work and worlds of labour through the lens of 'intersectionality'. We will draw insights from diverse fields such as Queer Studies, Culture Studies, Development Studies, Anthropology and Labour Studies. How do we re-define, reconceptualize and re-categorize women's work? What conceptual tools can be derived from the women workers' protest movements, everyday negotiations, expressions and imaginations? These are some of the questions that will be addressed at The Book Café.


WOMEN AND FAITH

Fellowship on Role of Women in Inter-faith Harmony

One of the Foundation's most recently launched Fellowships is a project by Prof. Krishna Menon, School of Human Studies, Ambedkar University Delhi, that examines the role of gender in spiritual domains and nurturing interfaith harmony.

Women's efforts at peace-making and creating harmony in divisive societies is now more than ever crucially relevant. 'What would interfaith dialogue look like if women were a robust and significant part of it – not as the target audience of such efforts, but as leaders? Is there room in such dialogues for women?' This project seeks to curate and understand the various attempts made by women across time and space to engage in inter-religious discourse. It will critically examine the conditions and agents that encourage women's participation in nurturing interfaith harmony and how it could help to recast religion and spiritual traditions in a contemporary, egalitarian and relevant framework.

With a proposed timeline of two years, starting March 2022, the Fellowship is well underway, with a bibliography and abstract already in place.










Commemorating the 32nd anniversary of His Holiness receiving the Nobel Peace Prize in December 2021, the Foundation collaborated with Tibet Museum and India Habitat Centre to put together its annual edition of 'The Dalai Lama in Frames'. The exhibition was curated as a pictorial biography of His Holiness' life, focusing on his journey and efforts to promote human values, inter-religious harmony, India's civilisational heritage and the preservation of Tibet's religion and culture.















The exhibition 'Dalai Lama Framed in Pictures and Anecdotes' was inspired by the book *His Holiness the Dalai Lama in 100 Anecdotes*, authored by Arthy Muthanna Singh and Mama Nainy. Drawing on several anecdotes from the book, the exhibition commemorates His Holiness receiving the Nobel Peace Prize for his peaceful solutions based on tolerance and mutual respect to preserve the historical and cultural heritage of his people. The publisher, Penguin Random House, granted the Foundation permission to use text from the book while the accompanying photographs were generously donated by the Office of His Holiness the Dalai Lama, Tibet Museum and the Library of Tibetan Works & Archives. The exhibition was on display from 9th–26th December 2022.







Under the Blue Skies






His Holiness The Fourteenth Dalai Lama: An Illustrated Biography

The launch of *His Holiness The Fourteenth Dalai Lama: An Illustrated Biography* presented global audiences with a rare opportunity to witness the rich conversation between three of His Holiness' most trusted companions – Tenzin Geyche Tethong, His Holiness's former Secretary & author of the book; Tenzin Choegyal, the younger brother of His Holiness; and Rajiv Mehrotra, a student of His Holiness for 40 years. With unique intimacy and depth, the speakers drew on their association with His Holiness to touch on various aspects of his persona: as a teacher, a brother, a mentor and a leader.





His Holiness The Dalai Lama in 100 Anecdotes

His Holiness the Dalai Lama in 100 Anecdotes highlights His Holiness' awe-inspiring life and his constant efforts towards fostering global harmony, painting a vivid picture of the leader in 100 anecdotes and fifty evocative illustrations. The discussion between authors Arthy Singh and Mamta Nainy, and Rajiv Mehrotra, who penned the foreword to the book, illuminated the life and teachings of the Dalai Lama, who is regarded by many as a manifestation of Buddha, even as he describes himself as 'a simple monk'.

WISCOMP's most recent publication is a comprehensive report documenting the key developments in Afghanistan since the Taliban takeover in August 2021. It assesses the impact of the Taliban rule on the lives of women and centres the voices of women in Afghanistan and the Afghan diaspora.

Navigating the Terrain of Gender Justice: A Handbook for Gender Audits at Higher Education Institutes in India




South Asian Perspectives on Sustainable Development and Gender Equality


Embracing Diversity in Faiths, Philosophies & Traditions

VIRTUAL SCREENINGS & DISCUSSIONS WITH UNIVERSITY STUDENTS



As part of His Holiness' commitment to fostering inter-faith harmony, the Foundation is facilitating a series of virtual film screenings and discussions with the students and faculty of University for Peace, Costa Rica; MIT World Peace University, India; and University of Colombo, Sri Lanka. Some of the award-winning films include 'Ahimsa Gandhi: The Power of the Powerless'; 'Mission: Joy - Finding Happiness in Troubled Times' as well as Nobel Peace Prize legacy films from PeaceJam like 'The Dalai Lama: Scientist'.

The series started in July 2022, with His Holiness- and Desmond Tutu-centric 'Mission Joy'. The screening was supplemented by discussions with the students, all of whom participated actively.





FUR FILM CHALLENGE: COMPASSION AND INTERFAITH HARMONY

Expressions of Compassion and Interfaith Harmony, titled and modelled directly after His Holiness' philosophy, was a hugely successful Foundation & PSBT collaboration. During the COVID pandemic, it invited professional and amateur filmmakers to produce short films using inexpensive technology, capturing the spirit of compassion in action. While all award-winning films were widely distributed and viewed on the Internet, the top award-winning film was selected for the International Documentary Filmmakers Association Festival in Amsterdam – the Mecca of documentary filmmaking.



PORTRAITS:2020 by Amartya Ray
Portraits: 2020 is an intimate observation of how the
pandemic has affected us as human beings both on
a social as well as a psychological level. It observes 6
scenes occurring around a death.



LETTERS by Raunak Dhupar & Rachna Chandira Khat, is the story of two individuals who are dealing with loss and isolation in times of Covid. A letter exchange program connects Muskaan and Dadi, two strangers, to each other through the medium of letters.



KHIDKIYAN by Arjun Samantaray Khidkiyan, is a tale of the pandemic, seen through the protagonist's window, who has been consumed by the emptiness outside, and the chaos it has cast within.



CHARET by Sudipta Kundu & Nandita Paul Charet, a railway hawker, and his survival during lockdown.



WHAT DO I SAY? By Lohit Lodhwal 'What do I Say?' traces the journey of a Social Work graduate who is volunteering in the compensation process for the survivors of North-East Delhi violence. Owing to the imposed lockdown after the onset of Covid, she operates from her house.



CREMATION DIARY by Bishwajit Sheel Narrated from the point of view of the filmmaker, the storyline is woven around sharing of experiences between the film maker and an NGO worker Pinak Roy who, along with his team was entrusted by the administration for COVID-DEAD cremations.

FUR GOLDEN LOTUS AWARDS




MONTHLY FILM FESTIVAL SINCE 2018




FILMS BY THE FOUNDATION

Happiness Class: A Film by Samina Mishra

Inspired by His Holiness' commitment to nurture social, emotional and ethical learning amongst the young, the Delhi Government evolved a Happiness Curriculum for its schools in 2018. Soon thereafter, the Foundation commissioned Happiness Class, a film that captures the curriculum's impact on children and teachers, sensitively portraying contemporary issues in education. It has been steadily receiving accolades from educationists since its release in April 2021, and is being screened widely at film festivals, including the Dharamshala International Film Festival.

Most recently, the film was screened at the India International Centre, New Delhi, followed by an interaction between the filmmaker, Samina Mishra, renowned educationist, Abha Adams, and Dr. Manish Jain, Assistant Professor at Ambedkar University, Delhi.



The Geshema is Born: A Film by Malati Rao




The Geshema is Born traces the journey of Namdol Phuntsok, the first woman to ever be awarded the highest degree in Tibetan philosophy – the Geshe degree. Released three years ago, the Foundation-supported film continues to be screened across the world at various festivals and has won three prestigious awards. Most recently, the film featured in the Wisdom Quarterly American Buddhist Journal and was selected as part of the monthly Film Club of Tricycle magazine. The film premiered on Dutch Public Television and discussions are underway with Netflix and VOD for digital screening rights; additionally, a Tokyo-based streaming platform is already in the process of distributing the film in Japanese.



The Foundation's social media presence has grown steadily over the past year, successfully reaching out to multiple sections of society.




WEEKLY WISDOM BYTES

Forging the Way Forward



PROPOSED TEACHINGS BY HIS HOLINESS IN DELHI

The Foundation extends a request to His Holiness to host 2-3 days of teachings to a cross-section of influential decision-makers and thought leaders across social, cultural and political terrains. This would be in line with the teachings that the Foundation has organised for nearly 15 years in Delhi.

SUMMER SCHOOL IN UPEACE COSTA RICA

The Foundation is collaborating with UPeace to host a summer school for Indian university students in June 2023. The four-week curriculum is expected to involve programmes on nurturing peace within and without, based on the teachings of His Holiness, as well as a course on Dalai Lama Studies.





FELLOWS' TEACHING ENGAGEMENTS

Creating a bridge between the Dalai Lama Studies and the Nalanda Studies Fellowships, the Foundation's 2021 Fellows have been invited to MIT World Peace University in Pune for a series of lectures, starting in November 2022. Incorporating knowledge, understanding and realisation, the Fellows' talks will feature philosophies from Nalanda's inclusive tradition.

COMPASSION & RESILIENCE BOOTCAMP

After the enthusiastic response to the first and second cycles of the Compassion & Resilience Fellowship, the Foundation is planning a short bootcamp to continue these trainings in a residential medium, a training 'Bootcamp' for young people under the age of 30. The Foundation also plans to continue and expand the programme in coming years with lectures on His Holiness' teachings.





CREEDS OF OUR TIMES CONVERSATIONS

In partnership with India International Centre, the Foundation is set to launch 'Creeds of Our Times', a monthly conversation series with global thought leaders, led by Rajiv Mehrotra, celebrating religious diversity.

MONASTIC RETREAT WITH GESHE TASHI TSERING

As part of His Holiness' commitment to understanding the Nalanda tradition, a seven-day retreat at the Gyudmed Monastery in Karnataka has been planned for February 2023 to invite participants to an immersion experience in a monastic setting that explores Buddhist practice and the daily lives of Tibetan monks. Geshe Tashi Tsering will be the principal teacher and the structure will be inspired by Geshe la's previous course 'Foundations of Buddhist Thought'. This consists of six modules – The Four Noble Truths, The Two Truths; (Relative Truth; Ultimate Truth), Buddhist Psychology, The Awakening Mind, Emptiness and Tantra.





EXPLORING THE COSMOLOGY OF TIBETAN HEALING

A multi-year project, this is envisioned as a holistic look at the entire universe of the idea of healing, as has been practised by Tibetans for centuries. The Foundation will develop a series of films to help the viewer understand the various pillars on which ideas around Tibetan healing practices are erected. It can also include perspectives from across the world in various forms: books, podcasts, videos, films, seminars, interactive websites. These will probe into the reasons such practices were thought to be crucial to healing and attempt a scientific understanding of the way human consciousness works. The ultimate aim is to bring complexity to the idea of physical and emotional wellness, and to begin conversations on an integrative and holistic approach to health. With adequate support, the Tibetan Healing Project has the potential to become a groundbreaking project. A proposal to the Templeton Foundation is being drafted.



WRITERS ON SPIRITUALITY & RELIGION: VIRTUAL CONVERSATIONS

Featuring guests from diverse spiritual traditions, schools of philosophy and existentialist schools of science, an online conversation series with prominent authors is being curated to foreground different perspectives on life.

HIS HOLINESS' COMMENTARY ON THE LAMRIM

The Foundation is evolving a study group on the secular teachings of His Holiness The Dalai Lama, based on his writings and the *Lamrim*.
